# Doctrine of Jesus Christ: He was fully human and fully God

# I. He was fully human

## A. His virgin conception

- 1. It was a miracle <u>Genesis 3:15</u> and the "seed of the woman" and <u>Matthew 1:18-20</u> "conceived of the Holy Spirit"
- 2. It was the only way to unite His Deity and His humanity
  - a. Descending from heaven not very human
  - b. Having two Earthly parents and used by God is like prophets not like God on Earth
- 3. How else would Jesus be without sin with 2 Earthly parents? <u>Luke 1:34-35</u>

## B. His human body

- 1. He was born and He grew <u>Luke 2:52</u>
- 2. His body had physical characteristics: tired, hungry, thirsty
- 3. He had a resurrected body <u>Luke 24:36-43</u>

#### C. He had human emotions

- 1. He wept over Lazarus <u>John 11</u>
- 2. His "anger" with temple money changers
- D. His family and neighbors saw Him as human

#### II. He was fully God.

#### A. Scripture is plain

1. Theos – Greek word for God: John 1:1, 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 1:1 and Romans 9:4-5

- 2. Kyrios Greek word for Lord 6,814 times in New Testament
  - a. Luke 2:11 "...who is Christ the Kyrios"
  - b. Luke 1:39-45 "mother of my Kyrios"

## B. Evidence of His Deity

- 1. His authority Matthew 8:26-27
- 2. He is eternal Revelation 22:13 "Alpha and Omega"
- 3. He knows all things Mark 2:5-12
- 4. He is Sovereign Matthew 5:21-22; 27-28, 31-32 "...but I say to you..."
- 5. He is worthy of worship Philippians 2:9-11

# III. Why Does this Matter?

## A. His humanity

- 1. He had to be fully man to be our sacrifice
- 2. Early heresy of Docetism "seemed to be real"- 1st John 4:2-3
- 3. He obeyed when Adam didn't; Garden of Eden vs. Wilderness Temptation
- 4. He was our Sacrifice Substitute Hebrews 2:14-18
- 5. He was an example of how to act  $-1^{st}$  Peter 2:21

#### B. His Deity

- 1. Who else can save everyone everywhere for 2,000 years but God?
- 2. Who else can do the actual work of salvation other than God?
- 3. Who else but Jesus can bridge the gap between man and God?

#### C. Arianism and Council of Nicea – AD 325

D. <u>Chalcedean Definition – AD 451</u> (Correcting four doctrinal errors: Arianism, Apollinarianism, Nestorianism, and Eutychianism)

**IV. My "Take Away"** – His suffering on the cross had to hurt like a human because it was my sin that put Him there. His resurrection proves He was fully God.

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
