## I. Why Christmas?

### II. It's God's timing and His plan – Jesus's Family Tree

- A. 2nd Samuel 7:11b -16 the Davidic covenant
- B. Jeremiah 22:24-30 the curse of Jeconiah
- C. Matthew 1 Matthew's focus in his gospel is on which group of people? Jews!
  - 1. v.1 Why start off with David and Abraham? COVENANTS
  - $2. \underline{v.17} 3$  sets of "14's"? Not accurate Jewish genealogies very often called someone a son who may have been a grandson, etc. Notice in v.1 again Jesus was not the "son" of either Abraham or David directly
  - Matthew is showing his Jewish audience that Jesus of Nazareth fits the pattern and the promise

#### D. Dr. Ivan Panin's Numerics in Scripture

- 1. Dr. Panin figured out "rules" in the first 17 verses of Matthew 1 each rule had to be divisible by the number 7 He then found a bunch of rules that would fit: the number of words, letters, vowels, consonants, names, male names, generations, words start with consonants, words start with vowels, etc.
- 2. What's the probability of finding the rules to work in these verses?
- o 7 x 1 rule: 7 attempts to get it right
- o 7 x 2 rules: 49 for 2 to get it right
- o 7 x 3 rules: 343 for 3 to get it right
- o 7 x 9 rules: 40,353,607 for 9 to get it right
- O To do 9 rules:  $10 \text{ minutes } / 8 \text{ hrs. } \frac{\text{day}}{40 \text{ hrs. }} \frac{\text{week}}{50 \text{ wks. }} = 3,362 \text{ years}$
- > Dr. Panin found 31 rules!



- E. What about the curse of Jeconiah?
  - 1. <u>Luke 3:23-38</u> Luke's focus in his gospel is on which group of people? (Gentiles)
  - Note Luke starts at Joseph and works toward Adam ( $\underline{v.38}$ ) Why would Luke go to Adam? For us Gentiles we can all get back to Adam
  - 2. <u>Luke 3:23</u> "as was supposed" Strong's G 3543 nomizo means supposed or deemed
  - <u>Acts 16:27</u> When the jailer woke and saw that the prison doors were open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, **supposing** that the prisoners had escaped. (ESV)
  - 3. <u>v.31</u> the son of Melea, the son of Menna, the son of Mattatha, **the son of Nathan**, the son of David The curse of Jeconiah did not come through Nathan/Mary but came through Solomon/Joseph
  - The "throne of David" line was through Joseph and the bloodline through Mary
  - 4. Numbers 27 and 36: Daughters of Zelophehad
    - v.8 "... 'If a man dies and has no son, then you shall transfer his inheritance to his daughter."
    - v.11B "And it shall be for the people of Israel a statute and rule, as the LORD commanded Moses."
    - <u>- 36:6</u> This is what the LORD commands concerning the daughters of Zelophehad: 'Let them marry whom they think best, only they shall marry within the clan of the tribe of their father.

#### III. God's love for us

Romans 5:8: "...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (ESV)
