



Lesson 39: Sermon on the Mount - Part 4 <u>Matthew 5:21-48</u> <u>Luke 6:27-36</u>

I. Six Examples of Exceeding Righteousness and Being Perfect

- A. Anger; Lust; Divorce; Oaths; Retaliation; Love Your Enemies
- B. "You have heard ____ but I say ____"
 - 1. Heard it from who? v.20 scribes and Pharisees
 - 2. Are these "menfolk" issues? These sins can be committed by anyone
 - a. "your brother", divorce, no women's testimony in Jewish law, anger/murder/war

II. Anger - <u>vv.21-26</u>

A. <u>vv.21-22</u>

- 1. Murder only in NT 12 times
- 2. Kill in NT 75 times
- 3. Hebrew understands the difference
 - a. rasah to murder in 10 Commandments
 - b. *naka* kill/slay
 - c. Only God can justify killing for His name's sake
- 4. Numbers 25:16-18

B. v.22 - murder starts with anger

- 1. insults/good-for-nothing "Raca" only time in the Bible Aramaic meaning is "empty headed"
- 2. moros fool
- 3. *Gehenna* hell (also in vv. 29 and 30)
- C. vv.23-26 two illustrations of "above and beyond"
 - 1. Note the "you" you have been accused and your brother is hauling you to court

III. Lust - <u>vv.27-30</u>

A. <u>vv.27-28</u>

- 1. Lusting is not ok for "everyone" pas
- 2. "looks at" see with the mind's eye

B. <u>vv.29-30</u>

- 1. Your hands and your eyes
- 2. Causes you to sin Stumbling blocks

IV. Divorce - <u>vv.31-32</u>

- A. Deuteronomy 24:1-4
- B. Jesus later explains this is a heart issue Matthew 19:1-12
- C. There was never a command for divorce it was a concession
- D. "Sexual immorality" Greek word is porneia

V. Oaths - <u>vv.33-37</u>

A. Jewish culture apparently got close to saying "I swear to God" (Swear to heaven, Swear to earth, Swear to Jerusalem, Swear to your own head)

- B. Just be honest and mean what you say
- C. Some manuscripts say "evil one"

VI. Retaliation – <u>vv.38-42</u>

- A. <u>v.38</u> where is this said? <u>Exodus 21:22-27</u>
- B. More "go above and beyond"
 - 1. $\underline{v.39}$ Turn the other cheek
 - 2. $\underline{v.40}$ Suing somebody for their long handles?
 - 3. <u>v.41</u> Roman soldiers would often make people tote stuff
 - 4. $\underline{v.42}$ this is not a vow of poverty

VII. Love your Enemies - vv.43-47

- A. Where is it said "hate your enemy"? Leviticus 19:18
- B. Love in Hebrew not differentiated
- C. Primary Greek words for love:
 - 1. phileo showing signs/approval Matthew 6:5 25 times in the NT
 - 2. agape showing emotion 142 times in NT
- D. Be perfect? (I'm in trouble)

VIII. <u>Luke 6:27-36</u>

- A. <u>vv.27-28</u> commands action: Love, Do good, Bless, Pray
- B. $\underline{v.36}$ In addition to perfection show mercy

IX. My "Take Away"

- Imagine a world where we showed this much agape
- > The outpouring of my love begins when I:
 - o Control my anger
 - Control my lust
 - \circ Ensure my word is my bond
 - Turn the other cheek
